MINISTER'S MESSAGE Living in Hope: 'Because He lives, I can Face Tomorrow'

People all over the world are appalled by the protracted war in Ukraine and the devastation that President Putin's army continues to wreak on human lives and property since 24th February 2022 when Russian forces invaded Ukraine. Stories of brutal killings and the maiming of innocent Ukrainians - men, women, and children - are sickening. These tragedies remind us of our propensity to evil and recall Paul's thoughts about a groaning world that needs to be liberated from the sinfulness of humankind. As Paul wrote in Romans 8:22-23, both

believers and nature groan together as they long to be liberated from the consequences of sin. When human beings sin, both the human world and the natural world for which humans have responsibility are negatively impacted. In the midst of these problems, Easter brings us hope and promises a future that is void of problems or the possibility of surmounting our problems when we put our trust in the risen Saviour.

On Sunday 24th April, Russia, and Ukraine both marked Orthodox Easter Sunday, with pictures showing Vladimir Putin in a Moscow church as his army's missiles continued to rain down on Ukrainian civilians across the country. In Kyiv, the capital of Ukraine, prayers were held for those fighting on the front lines and others trapped in places like Mariupol. Ukrainian president Volodymyr Zelensky vowed in an Easter message that no 'wickedness' will destroy the country and prayed God to return happiness to children and bring solace to grieving mothers. Pope Francis has since appealed for a truce in war-torn Ukraine 'to ease the suffering of exhausted people'. It is so difficult to imagine how Ukrainians will live with the scars of war when the conflict is ended and how young children are going to grow up in such difficult circumstances of war and man's inhumanity to man. However, the stories and experiences of other people who have faced difficult days can bring hope to all those who are suffering from any kind of problem or uncertainty.

The hymn titled 'Because He lives' was written by Bill and Gloria Gaither in the late 1960s when they were struggling with health problems, and Gloria was pregnant with their child. There was bad news all around them, of the Vietnam War, civil unrest, the drug culture, and violence in the streets. Was this the kind of world in which to raise a family? Discouraged and disheartened they looked for signs of hope. One day in the spring, Bill walked out of his office to inspect a newly paved parking area. Construction workers had covered it with several coats of asphalt. Bill was satisfied with the job, but as he turned, he noticed a tiny blade of grass poking through the layers of rock and tar to reach into the sunlight. In early summer the baby was born, and when Bill and Gloria brought their child home, they wrote a song of joy, remembering the blade of grass that prospered even in a hostile environment. More importantly, they remembered that their baby could indeed face uncertain days because Christ lives. The chorus of that song speaks volumes:

Because He lives I can face tomorrow; Because He lives all fear is gone; Because I know, I know He holds the future, And life is worth the living just because He lives.

Dear friends, as we continue to face the challenges and uncertainties of life, may we entrust our fears to the risen Saviour, resisting all fear because he alone knows the future.

Covid Guidance in Church & Presbytery Mission Plan

The recent removal of the last of the lockdown measures by the Scottish Government has allowed us to reflect these newly extended freedoms within our church building. Except for the sanitising stations and the one-way system, we have been able to remove most of the other physical restrictions and practices within the building which have been in place throughout the pandemic. But it also requires every member of the congregation to play their part, as legislation has given way to guidance and personal responsibility. Safe practices promoted over the past months should now be firmly embedded within our mind-sets and the expectation of the Kirk Session is that worshippers will continue to follow these basic approaches and measures.

One noticeable feature of our current response is the retention of the one metre spacing and the barrier tape within the pews on the Left Hand (Organ) Side as you enter the building. Designated the 'Protected' zone, its purpose is to accommodate those members of the congregation who may feel a little hesitant in returning to church with all the previous safety measures removed. Again, please be responsible worshippers and allow this area to be used for the purposes for which we have intended and do not occupy it because you have always sat there in the past.

The second significant piece of information I wish to convey concerns the release of the Draft Fife Presbytery Mission Plan which establishes the proposed future resourcing in terms of both Ministries (Ministers, Ordained Local Ministers, Readers, etc.,) and buildings (churches, halls, community halls, etc.,) across Fife Presbytery. Within our newly emerging North Fife Cluster the Plan recommends our 'union' with Wormit, Balmerino and Creich, Flisk & Kilmany, along with the allocation of 1 Minister of Word and Sacrament (MWS) and the retention of our church building, the hall and Kirk House complex. (The establishment of such a union cannot however take place until 2023 when the 7-year reviewable tenure of our minister will be undertaken.) Tayport and Leuchars would also unite to form the second union within our Cluster with a similar allocation of 1 MWS. A small team nominated by the Kirk Session will attend a meeting with a representative(s) from the Mission Strategy & Planning Task Group in Cupar on the 4th May to clarify concerns over perceived inconsistencies in the ministries allocation and our resultant underrepresentation in North Fife.

Finally, can I please ask that you continue to pray for the Mission Plan as together we seek to discern God's plan for the future of the Church of Scotland in both Fife Presbytery and our North Fife Cluster in particular?

During this week the well-known red envelopes will be in the pews for anyone wishing to donate. However if you prefer to go digital then go to <u>www.caweek.org</u> and you will be able to make an independent online donation.

For those who are fit and active and wish to go a step (or two!) further, Christian Aid can also be supported via the Kiltwalk. In-person kiltwalks are again taking place in our major cities with Dundee's scheduled for 21st August. Christian Aid is accepted as a nominated charity by the Kiltwalk which then tops up all your donations by 50% from the Hunter Foundation.

In addition there is a virtual kiltwalk over the weekend of 7th-9th October when you can choose where and how far you wish to walk, run, cycle etc.

Nifty Newport Knitters



It's exactly three years since my last report on our charity knitting group. This doesn't mean we have been idle for three years. Indeed, Covid and its enforced isolation and lockdowns provided the ideal conditions for those of us who love nothing more than an evening of undisturbed knitting, and I think you'll agree the following story is clear proof of that.

When Philip went to lock the front door of the church last Sunday after the service, he was rather surprised to see six large bulging carrier bags on the floor of the vestibule. They certainly hadn't been there before the service when Sheila was ringing the bell and the last

latecomers were trying to slip in unnoticed. Wherever had they come from? On examination they were found to be full, pressed down and overflowing with knitted squares! Hundreds of them. Philip guessed it might be something to do with the knitting group and consulted me.

Together we managed to just fit them into the boot of my car (which fortunately I had with me – I don't usually!). We were quite mystified over the source of this bounty, and soon there were several of us scratching our heads over it. However, by a process of elimination, more head scratching and solid sleuthing, we finally came up with a possible answer. Later in the day, I visited our prime suspect and learned that our calculations were accurate. This wonderful donation to our group has been her Covid achievement. Only a knitter will appreciate the effort and wool that have gone into the production of 504 8" squares. I like to think that she benefited too from knowing that her efforts were going to provide such warmth and comfort to those with very little.

Usually we post our squares to the Knit a Square charity in South Africa, where they are sewn into blankets for orphaned and vulnerable children. This time we will also sew some together ourselves – 42 make a very substantial blanket – and give them to the Salvation Army. A quick piece of mental arithmetic will show we have enough for exactly 12 blankets. Fantastic!

For those who would like to knit squares – some vital statistics. Double knitting wool, 4mm (old size 8) needles, 42 stitches and 84 rows, and leave one long end for sewing up.

For those who would like to know more about our knitting group, phone me. A proper report coming soon!
