

MINISTER'S MESSAGE - Easter 2022

John 20:10-18: Why are you weeping? Why are you crying?

Charles Darwin once declared emotional tears "purposeless," and nearly 150 years later emotional crying remains one of the human body's more confounding mysteries. Though some other species shed tears reflexively because of pain or irritation, humans are the only creatures whose tears can be triggered by their feelings. In babies, tears have the obvious and crucial role of soliciting attention and care from adults. But what about in grownups? That's less clear. It's obvious that strong emotions trigger them, but why?

My message is centred on crying in a specific context within scripture and in relation to Mary Magdalene who had visited the tomb of Jesus on Easter morning to anoint his body but failed to find the body. When Simon Peter and the other disciple that Jesus loved visited and confirmed that the body of Jesus was not in the tomb, they returned to their homes, but Mary Magdalene stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she stooped to investigate the tomb and saw two people in white. She recognised that they were angels sitting where the body of Jesus had lain - one at the head and the other at the feet. The angels said to her, 'woman why are you weeping?' She said to them 'because they have taken away my Lord and I don't know where they have laid him'. When she turned around, she saw Jesus standing but didn't know it was Jesus. Jesus said to her 'woman, why are you weeping, whom are you seeking?' Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him 'sir, if you have carried him away tell me where you have laid him, and I will carry him away'. Jesus said to her, 'Mary!' Instantly she recognised his voice and said to him 'my teacher', and Jesus said to her 'do not hold me for I have not yet ascended to the father. But go to my brethren and say to them, 'I am ascending to my father and your father, to my God and your God'. Mary Magdalene went at once and said to the disciples 'I have seen the Lord'. And she told them that Jesus had commissioned her.

Why are you weeping? Why are you crying?

Mary Magdalene had good reasons to cry. She had observed the brutality of the crucifixion and witnessed the burial rites of her Lord. She wept because she thought she had lost the only man who ever truly understood and loved her, the Saviour who delivered her from bondage and gave her a new life. She couldn't face the future without this almighty Saviour, the light had gone out of her life, and she was in the deep darkness of despair.

Why are you weeping? I wonder if Christ is asking that question to us today: Woman, man, child, why are you weeping? What are the things about your life and about our world that make us want to cry? The invasion of Ukraine by the forces of Vladimir Putin and at his command since February 2022, and the massive destruction taking place in that sovereign state including the killing of men, women, and children, brings tears to our eyes. But some of us are weeping because of our past, our failures, and our sense of shame over what we have done. James 4:9-11 encourages us to weep over sin, 'grieve, mourn, and wail. Change your laughter to mourning and your joy to gloom because of what you have done'. Some are weeping over their savage temptations and heavy responsibilities in the present, and over their fears and anxieties about the unknown future. However, 'never let the future disturb you. You will meet it, if you must, with the same weapons of reason which today arm you against the present' (Marcus Aurelius).

Our temptations will always be with us, our responsibilities and anxieties may remain, but the resurrection of Jesus Christ puts all these things into a new light. It tells us that Christ died for our sins and has been vindicated, that he triumphed over death. And it assures us that one day, God is going to make the whole universe new, and he is going to wipe away all tears from our eyes.

As we look forward to another Easter celebration in 2022, let us thank God for tears that make us realise our need for God and for each other and that enable us to repent from the sin that clings so closely. Let us remember that we shall go on weeping in this life until the risen Lord says to us, 'why are you weeping?', there is no need to go on weeping, be of good cheer, it is I, be not afraid'.

Covid Guidance in Church

The Church of Scotland Covid Guidance Group continue to encourage places of worship to follow the Scottish Government's general guidance on staying safe and protecting others. Property Matters

At a first glimpse many of our fine ecclesiastical buildings give the impression that they have stood resolutely against the elements since the dawn of time itself. On closer inspection however, it becomes clear that they have been continually and lovingly restored and repaired to withstand the ravages of time and weathering. Acid rain has eaten away at the intricately carved stonework, frost has exposed structural defects in the rock, damp and rot has crept silently into the woodwork and rust has set in corroding the pipework from the inside. Too often however this battle is lost as dwindling congregations do not have the necessary skills or finance to undertake such essential restorative work, resulting in the permanent closure of the church building and potentially the cessation of worship within that community.

Our church is no different and a fine team of dedicated elders and members of the congregation have over the years dutifully addressed every aspect of the fabric and preservation of our buildings - undertaking work themselves or calling in professional help when needed - all essentially for our (the congregation's) continuing safety and comfort. Charles Moodie and the late Ally Dempster spring to mind since my arrival in Newport, and in more recent times Don Macleod has fulfilled the role as our Property Manager. Designating a five-year rolling plan of inspection and maintenance for all church properties, Don has also transformed and streamlined our record-keeping system including the obligatory certification processes. Don has since worked steadfastly to minimize both impact and costs by undertaking or coordinating essential repairs himself, or by collaborating with congregational volunteers or trades people to complete the task. Don's commitment to the role had even extended to the installation of Wi-Fi devices in the church and hall to monitor the temperature from his home in The Gauldry as the ageing heating system began to fail with increasing regularity.

It is therefore right and fitting that we should acknowledge Don's achievements, his dedication and commitment to the role as our Property Manager following his recent decision to resign from the post for personal and family reasons. In my visits to the church during each week it was commonplace to see Don's e-bike or car parked within the church grounds as he attended to an essential inspection or repair in his usual quiet and competent manner. But the increasing demands placed "to keep the ship afloat" as Don himself expressed it, was an ever-increasing burden which seriously impacted on his ability to secure quality personal and family time. Don, we thank you most sincerely for all you have done for this congregation, its safety and welfare, through your resolute dedication to the maintenance and upkeep of our church and manse buildings.

Church of Scotland Guild



As many of you already know the Newport-on-Tay Guild has recently been formed and a Dedication Service was held on Sunday 20th March. The Guild is a Christian organisation, part of the Church of Scotland and grounded in the service of Jesus Christ. It invites both men and women to take part and enables them to express their faith in worship, prayer, action and fellowship.

The group has already met, talking mainly about the war in the Ukraine and our twin village Zolotarevo and wondered what we could do to help. We have contacts in Zolotarevo, which is relatively safe at present and our friends there tell us that they have 400 refugees staying there presently and that the school is preparing food daily. NAZTA (our twinning association) has already sent £1000 to help with these costs.

The Guild were given two requests from our contacts in Ukraine - money and prayer!

An ongoing vigil has been prepared to take place every Thursday, on the green outside the church at 7pm where prayers will be said and visitors invited to tie a ribbon on the wall to recreate the flag of Ukraine. There will also be a chance to donate money to the ongoing work in Zolotarevo. If you are unable to be present at the vigils but would like to take part then ribbons will be available at manna.


