

MINISTER'S MESSAGE - Pentecost 2022 'I will send down showers in this season; there shall be showers of blessings.' Ezekiel 34: 26b

Accept Pentecost greetings in the name of our risen and ascended Saviour Jesus Christ and welcome to another message from my desk during this time of Pentecost celebrations of the church and the Platinum Jubilee of our Queen.

Pentecost is commemorated on the seventh Sunday after Easter when the Church celebrates the descent of the Holy Spirit on the disciples of Jesus after his Ascension into heaven. Jesus called the coming of the Holy Spirit, "the gift that the Father

promised". This gift was transformative because after the event, the eleven disciples of Jesus were radically changed. Before Pentecost, they had been ordinary fishermen. They panicked in the face of danger and hardly comprehended what Jesus was teaching. They fell asleep during crucial moments of prayer and competed for top positions. They rebuked Jesus for talking about the cross and even denied knowing him when he was arrested.

After Pentecost, they were completely different. They were not nervous in the face of danger. They stood up to the very ones they had been afraid of and uttered strong and righteous statements instead of foolish and cowardly ones. They were filled with joy even in the face of great suffering and lived lives that gave vibrant testimony to Jesus Christ, going all over the world to boldly proclaim the gospel of Jesus. They laboured tirelessly, loving not only their friends but even their enemies, and willing to die for the cause of Christ.

As we celebrate Pentecost this year, we are thankful to God for the blessings we have received from the abundance of God's grace and pray that the Holy Spirit would fall afresh on us for greater exploits in the service of the Lord. We thank God that with increase easing of lockdown measures from covid, our congregation can now worship more freely, enjoy the congregational singing better including our beautiful choir singing introits and anthems more clearly without the use of face masks. We thank God for enabling us to successfully start Messy Church on Saturday 28th May. A massive turn out of families for this first day showed great promise for this new initiative in our congregation. We are hoping that more families in the community would find Messy Church a significant form of church for our children and adults as it provides an opportunity for creativity and hospitality. And that through this evangelistic programme the church and its members will receive fresh anointing from the Lord and be richly blessed in much the same way as the disciples of old who sought these spiritual blessing and went on to proclaim Christ boldly.

The hymn 'Even Me', with first lines, 'Lord I hear of showers of blessing Thou art scattering full and free' was written by Elizabeth Codner. One day she was reading the bible and came across a verse in Ezekiel that said, 'I will cause the shower to come down in his season; there shall be showers of blessing' (Ezekiel 34:26). While she was thinking about that verse a group of youths returned from a mission trip to Ireland and were excited that a spiritual awakening was going on in that country. They told her about it, but Elizabeth wondered whether these young people were just spectators to the revival, or if they had experienced the outpouring of God in their own lives. So, with the verse in Ezekiel still fresh in her mind, she said, 'while the Lord is pouring out such showers of blessing upon others, pray that some drops will fall on you'. A few days later, she wrote 'Even Me'. A few lines of the hymn would strengthen the point: Lord, I hear of showers of blessing Thou art scattering full and free; Showers the thirsty land refreshing - let some drops now fall on me. Even me, even me, let Thy blessing fall on me...

As we celebrate Pentecost, coinciding with the Platinum Jubilee of the Queen, may we thank God for the blessings of new life in Christ through the Holy Spirit and the gift and preservation of the life of the Queen and her distinguished reign in Great Britain. Let us seek God's blessings to strengthen us through our challenges in this life and enable us to be ambassadors for Jesus Christ. And let us remember that when the light of the Holy Spirit shines in our darkened hearts, we begin to experience supernatural blessings: There is cleansing power, there is joy, and there is an abiding peace.






