Minister: Dear Sisters and Brothers,
We are assembled here in God's name and presence to meet with him in our midst in his holy word. To witness the baptism of Anna-Danielle Amosons Chewachong and to remember with thanksgiving the life of late Mr Daniel Che Wachong who went to be with the Lord in June 2021. We come, bringing our own joys, secret sorrows, and burdens so that God will deliver us from our troubles and bless us abundantly. But first, let us prepare ourselves and examine our lives in silence as we call to mind our

sins, seeking God's grace that we may come near to him with true repentance and faith.

Act of Penitence (Rev Brian Oxburgh) The Prayer of Approach and Confession of Sins

Minister: Lord Jesus Christ, you are the helper of all who come to you for help, the life of all who believe, and the resurrection of the dead. We call upon you for Anna-Danielle, that she, being brought to your Holy Baptism, may receive the remission of her sins by spiritual regeneration. Be present with us in this time together as we come to worship you. Called to be your people, called to walk the way of Jesus we come with the offering of ourselves and seeking your words of comfort and challenge.

Living Jesus, we praise you because you show us that God is love: love which reaches to all people; love which does not count the cost of loving; love which never ends. Forgive us when we love ourselves and not you and when our love for others have been hindered by our own self pride and sense of accomplishment. We know that we have not been pure and holy, we have not been faithful and true, we have been entangled in the world, and overcome by evil. But you are a Father of mercy and you do not forsake the work of your hands. You are gracious to us whom you have redeemed by the precious blood of Christ. Therefore, we plead with you...
