MINISTER'S MESSAGE



Mark 1:14-20: Using Your Gifts for the Evangelisation of the Gospel

In his book 'Evangelism and the Sovereignty of God' published in 2012, J. I. Packer wonders whether 'if God is in control of everything, can Christians sit back and not bother to evangelise?' Packer concludes that a right understanding of God's sovereignty should enable Christians to engage in evangelism and mission. His question is significant because of increasing religious decline in some western countries.

Western Europe, where Protestant Christianity originated and Catholicism has been based for most of its history, is one of the world's most secular regions. Although most adults say they were baptised, today many do not describe

themselves as Christians. Some say they gradually drifted away from religion, stopped believing in religious teachings, or were alienated by scandals or church positions on social issues, including complacency. However, there are still so many people who would benefit from some form of evangelisation or outreach that might potentially bring them into the church. But most Christians in the West find it hard to engage in any form of evangelism because we think that is incompatible with tolerance and decency.

The growing secularism in most of the western world warrants us to revisit the words and commission of Jesus Christ when he commissioned his followers to go out and to make disciples of all nations baptising them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Jesus anticipated that universal commission by choosing and training the apostles to carry the message to the ends of the earth. These first disciples were involved in one kind of fishing but then Jesus called them to another kind of fishing. From fishing fish to fishing people!

Not all of us are called to the ministry of word and sacrament, but we can each bring our gifts from other areas of life and use them creatively for the salvation of mankind. For example, in much the same way as the fisherman brings fish out of one element into the other, out of water unto the land, so the Lord's fishermen were called to bring people out of darkness into light, out of the Kingdom of Satan into the Kingdom of God.

I don't know your particular gifts and areas of expertise. It may be medicine, business, teaching, plumbing, accountancy, sports and physical education, engineering, architecture, cheffing, and other trades you might have inherited from your family or learned yourself. Jesus said to the first disciples, that if they had learned their lake fishing from their fathers and grandfathers and older generations, now they were to learn their people fishing from him. And they did. They spent three years with Jesus, they listened to his teaching, they absorbed it deeply so that when their time came to witness, they were able to do it more easily. They watched Jesus put his fingers into the weak places of people's lives and all that he did in bringing himself to the real problems of everyday life. But above all they learned by simply being with their master. All Christians learn from Jesus each time they come to worship or read their bibles and I trust we now have the capacity and resources necessary to disciple others. After all, the apostle Peter speaks to us when he writes in 1 Peter 2:9 'But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praise of him who called you out of darkness into his marvellous light'.

This is the second month of the year 2023. Our New Year's resolutions are still fresh but may already be faltering! I hope and pray that we can become more determined to disciple others for Christ. We can achieve this by submitting ourselves to God for him to use what we have - our personal gifts and resources - to bring salvation to the many people who are longing for the life-giving word of God.

~ Fundraising for Ukraine

Morag Muir, a well known local artist has donated four prints of the 'Royal Knight' to be sold to raise funds for the Ukraine Appeal.

Catherine Johnston arranged a table at the Rotary Fair on Saturday 3rd December in the Blyth Hall. The first of these prints was raffled and £180 was raised.

The next print will be sold by silent auction at the Stewardship Fair on 5th February. The other two will be sold at events later in the year. In addition, the sunflower cards (both greeting and postcards) remain on sale through manna.

They continue to sell, though less quickly than initially.

All the money we raise for Ukraine is being transferred to the Newport and Zolotarevo Twinning Association (NAZTA) to support our friends there. Though less affected directly by the fighting than some parts of Ukraine, they have had power cuts and have also been hosting people fleeing the fighting.
