3) Stated Annual Meeting

The Stated Annual Meeting will take place this Sunday, 28th May, during the morning service. All members are invited to attend. There will be a brief summary of the finances of the past year and details of our budget for 2023. Thereafter a small number of other short reports will be given to update members on recent activities.

A group of Presbyterian Christians, Cameroonians living in Coventry will be visiting us this weekend. We shall have a retreat with them in church on Saturday afternoon and they will join us for worship on Sunday morning.

You will see that there is provision during the service for Cameroonians to lead singing for collections to support a Solar Panel Project at the Presbyterian Theological Seminary in Kumba-Cameroon, where all ministers of the PCC are trained.

5) Church Repairs

Preparatory work has now started to repair the roof and ceiling in the church; we will continue to worship in the hall meantime.
