

MINISTER'S MESSAGE

Embracing our Gifts: Building the Church in Unity and Love (1 Corinthians 12:12-27)

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Accept very warm fraternal greetings from the Minister's desk, here at Newport-on-Tay Church of Scotland.

On Sunday 28th May 2023 we celebrated the feast of Pentecost in grand style. It was a multi-ethnic worship service, made up of Newport-on-Tay church members and members of the Presbyterian Church in Cameroon who live in Coventry. Our brothers and sisters from Coventry were visiting my family and wanted to enjoy

We thank God for the rich fellowship that we shared together and the memories that will live into the future. The singing of Cameroonian choruses, accompanied by traditional drums, spiced the occasion. One of the songs that the Cameroonians sang included the following words. They also signify that Christians are interconnected for the good of all. As the Dalai Lama once commented elsewhere, 'we are not isolated individuals, but members of one human family. Church Ceiling Damage

Following the fall of plaster from the ceiling of the church nave after a storm in mid-February, our property team have been working hard to engage the appropriate contractors to repair the damage caused. This requires a scaffolding tower to be built in three locations within the church and, once the external roofing work has progressed sufficiently, the damaged plasterwork will be repaired and repainted. Following completion of this work, the scaffolding will be dismantled and the church thoroughly cleaned to allow us to return to worship there.

If all goes according to plan, this work should be completed by late-June and, all being well, we could be back in the church for the Young People Closing Service on 25th June – but no promises are being made!

As reported last month, our insurers have declined liability and so we will need to finance the whole cost from our reserves (which will reduce the income we receive from these investments in future years).

Meantime, while our services (both morning and evening) have had a different feel to them while we have worshipped in the hall, we are looking forward to being back in the familiar surroundings of the church.

Community Chest

The Community Chest Appeal supports the Rio's foodstuff collection for inclusion in their lunch provision programme or for distribution in conjunction with the local foodbank.

There continues to be a great response to this appeal so far and as the cost of living is still high, the need of some people may well be greater so please consider supporting this if you can. Any donations, no matter how small, are gratefully received.


Our year is speedily drawing to its close, and we will likely conclude in late-June with an Open Evening for parents, relatives and friends of the boys.


Thereafter, we will all then head off in our own directions to enjoy the benefits of a summer break before resuming again in late-August/early-September.
