

MINISTER'S MESSAGE



150 Years of Light and Service

The Newport-on-Tay Church of Scotland, initially known as St Thomas' Church holds a remarkable history of service and community engagements that has spanned 150 years. Since its inception beginning in 1870, the church has played a pivotal role in meeting the spiritual and physical needs of the Newport and surrounding communities.

As Newport continued to grow during the 19th century, it became evident that the existing parish church at Forgan could not adequately accommodate the needs of the expanding population. In response, an enthusiastic fundraising campaign was launched in 1868. Notably, a 'Committee of Ladies' significantly outperformed the all-male committee in

raising funds, reflecting the church's commitment to inclusivity from its early days.

St Thomas' Church was completed by the end of 1870 and opened its doors on 6th November 1870. Throughout its history, the church has been proactive in raising funds to meet the evolving needs of the community. In 1901, an ambitious fundraising campaign was initiated to extend the church, install an organ, and construct a manse. A Grand Bazaar held in Dundee raised a substantial sum of £2400, a remarkable achievement for the time. A 'Father' Willis organ, installed in the early 20th century, continues to enrich the church's musical heritage, having undergone refurbishment in 2016 to ensure its longevity.

In 1978, St Thomas' Church joined forces with St. Fillan's Church to become Newport-on-Tay Church of Scotland, and in 1981, they merged with Forgan Church. This construction strengthened the church's ability to serve the community, demonstrating its commitment to adapt and evolve while preserving its rich history.

As we celebrate the 150th anniversary of Newport-on-Tay Church of Scotland, we reflect on the extraordinary journey this church has undertaken, embodying the principles of service, inclusivity, and community engagement. Today, the church continues to be a beacon of light in Newport and its surrounding communities, providing spiritual sustenance to the weary souls and those seeking spiritual nourishment in secular Scotland. Our weekly Sunday Services, along with the work of the Youth Ministry, Sunday School, Youth Seekers, Messy Church including other outreach programmes to Newport Primary School, and the partnership in delivering pastoral care through foodbanks are testaments to the enduring impact of this church.

As we mark this momentous occasion, we pray for the church's continued success in bringing the good news of salvation and alleviating poverty and suffering in the Newport and surrounding communities.

The Pop-Up Post Office continues to run only on Wednesdays from 9:30 - 11:30am in the Kirk House Complex.





On Remembrance Sunday, 12th November 2023, our service will start at the earlier time of 10:50am to allow for the 2 minute silence at 11am.


All are welcome to join us in the Church and/or at the War Memorial for a service there at approx. 12.05pm.


Daily Reflections

Editorial

It's a standard British thing to do - talk about the weather - but given the rain we have had in the past couple of weeks it would be very amiss not to speak about it.



The floods that some local towns and villages have experienced recently is hard to imagine what they are going through. Especially coupled with the time of year it doesn't bear thinking about.

In Genesis Chapter 1, after God had created night and day, he separated the waters with land. Just a few chapters later on we read about the flood that God sent to earth. Although God was wanting to get rid of corruptness that had already appeared, the high waters covering the earth was not the end of the story. God sent a wind and the waters subsided and after a while the earth dried out and a new life was built. It feels very fitting to be reminded of this story and hopefully it will bring comfort to those who are out of their houses and despairing at what is facing them in the days, weeks and months ahead.

Yet it's at moments like this that communities come together with people offering rooms, houses, clothes, food etc for those who are displaced. When we ask in the church for donations of food for the foodbank, or for money towards a certain appeal, you support all these causes and it is so humbling to see. It may only be a small part of what is required but everything donated makes a difference even if it seems small.
