Now Newport-On-Tay Church of Scotland

Text: 1 Corinthians 3:10-16

Theme: Building on the Legacy of Christ: Honouring the Past, Sustaining the Present, and

Securing the Future

On April 23, 2008, Dr. Michael DeBakey received one of the highest honours in

the United States, the Congressional Gold Medal, for his extraordinary

contributions to heart surgery. During the ceremony, President Bush highlighted

Dr. DeBakey's legacy by saying, "His legacy is holding the fragile and sacred gift

of human life in his hands and returning it unbroken."

Dr. DeBakey's achievements were nothing short of miraculous. He invented

numerous medical devices and procedures, performed the first successful heart

bypass operation, and saved countless lives. But what's even more fascinating is

the story behind his work. As a child, Dr. DeBakey's mother taught him to sew—

a skill that might seem simple and unrelated to surgery. Yet, it was this very skill

that inspired him later in life. In the early 1950s, when he needed to design a graft

for replacing a diseased aorta, he turned to what he knew best. Using a synthetic

cloth called Dacron, he sketched out a design, cut the fabric, and sewed the first

prototype on his wife's Singer sewing machine.

Dr. DeBakey's story is a powerful reminder that the foundations we lay early in

life can shape our future in ways we may never expect. His mother's simple

teachings on sewing became the foundation for some of his greatest medical

breakthroughs.

This idea of building on a strong foundation brings us to our reflection today, as we celebrate 900 years of the Forgan Church, now known as Newport-On-Tay Church of Scotland. The apostle Paul, in 1 Corinthians 3:10-11, speaks of a foundation that is essential for every Christian life—the foundation of Jesus Christ. Just as Dr. DeBakey's work was grounded in the skills he learned as a child, our church has been built on the solid and unchanging foundation of Christ.

As we gather to celebrate 900 years of the Forgan Church, we are not merely marking the passage of time; we are standing upon an important legacy. Our church has been a beacon of faith, hope, and community for nearly a millennium, and today's celebration invites us to reflect on the foundation that has sustained us through the ages.

A Legacy Built on the Firm Foundation

The apostle Paul, in his letter to the Corinthians, speaks of the foundation of our Christian life, which is Jesus Christ Himself. Like skilled builders, those who came before us laid this foundation with care and dedication. They understood that no structure, whether physical or spiritual, can endure unless it is built on something solid and unchanging. For our ancestors, the foundation was clear: the gospel of Jesus Christ. This foundation has withstood wars, plagues, and countless societal changes, and it continues to support us today.

Imagine, if you will, the early days of this church, when our forebears, with limited resources but abundant faith, began to build what would become a spiritual home for generations. They likely faced challenges we cannot fully comprehend—perhaps harsh winters, political turmoil, or even personal doubts. Yet, they pressed on, laying stone upon stone, not just in the physical sense, but in the spiritual sense as well, grounded in the belief that their work was not in vain, because it was built upon the sure foundation of Christ.

Honouring Those Who Built Before Us

We remember today the ministers who preached the Word with passion and conviction, the elders who guided the congregation with wisdom, the families who kept the church alive through their attendance and prayers, and the countless unnamed individuals who served in quiet, humble ways—keeping the vision of the church alive. Each of them contributed to building upon the foundation that Paul speaks of. Their work has not been lost to time; it is seen in the very fabric of our church community today.

But let us also reflect on our role in this ongoing work. The foundation of Christ remains unchanged, but we are the current builders. What kind of structure are we adding to that foundation? Are we building with the enduring materials of faith, love, and truth, or are we tempted by the fleeting materials of this world—seeking security in wealth, status, or comfort?

A Story for Our Times

Let me share with you a story. There was a man who inherited a beautiful old home from his grandparents. The house had been in the family for generations, and though it showed signs of age, its foundation was as strong as the day it was built. The man, eager to modernize, began making changes—installing the latest gadgets, painting over the old wood, and even altering the original layout to suit his tastes. He spent all his money on these upgrades, thinking they would make the house perfect. But one day, a storm came, stronger than any before. The new additions were the first to go—windows shattered, the roof caved in, and the walls buckled. Yet, as the man stood amidst the wreckage, he noticed something remarkable. The foundation was still there, unshaken, just as his grandparents had left it. It was then that he realized the true value of what he had inherited. The foundation had endured, and because of it, he could rebuild, not just a house, but a home.

Building for the Future

As we celebrate 900 years, let us commit ourselves to preserving the legacy of our church. The foundation has been laid—Jesus Christ, our unchanging cornerstone. But the work is far from over. We must continue to build with care, using the materials of faith that will endure. We are not just maintaining a building or a tradition; we are nurturing a living community of believers who will, God willing, continue to gather here for another 900 years.

Let us enjoy the fruits of those who laboured before us but let us also plant seeds for those who will come after us. May we build in such a way that when future generations look back on our time, they will find that we, too, were faithful builders upon the foundation of Christ.

As we go forth, let us ask ourselves: On what is my life built? If all else falls away, will I stand firm on the foundation of Christ? For no other foundation will stand the test of time, but the one laid by Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

May we continue to build upon the foundation of Christ with wisdom, humility, and love, so that Forgan Church may stand as a testament to Your faithfulness for generations to come.
