
MINISTER'S MESSAGE

A Celebration of Ministry, Scholarship, and a Global Calling

Life is full of unexpected turns, and sometimes the road God leads us on is far beyond anything we could have imagined. On Saturday 29th March 2025, I will have the great joy of launching my new book "Intra-African Pentecostalism and the Dynamics of Power: The Nigerian Winners' Chapel in Cameroon". The event will take place at Newport-on-Tay Church of Scotland beginning at 6pm. But this evening will be more than just a book launch - it will be a time of deep reflection, thanksgiving, and celebration.

The occasion will mark another significant milestone in my journey: the recognition of my Coronation Medal, awarded in January 2024 in honour of my role in officiating at the Honours of Scotland at St Giles Cathedral, Edinburgh, in July 2023. This dual celebration will bring together friends, colleagues, and fellow believers, including Cameroonians from England and across Europe, joining hands with the Newportonians in what promises to be an unforgettable evening of joy, gratitude, and fellowship. The celebrations will culminate in a special worship service on Sunday 30th March where we will gather to give thanks for the incredible ways God continues to move in our lives.

Looking back over the past twenty-two years, I am overwhelmed by how God's providence has unfolded in my life. If someone had told me when I first stepped into ministry as an assistant pastor in a small, remote town in Cameroon that one day I would be serving in Scotland, writing books, and contributing to global theological conversations, I would have laughed in disbelief. At the time, such a future seemed



impossible. The Presbyterian Church in Cameroon, though a faithful and committed denomination, faces significant limitations in theological training and resources. Pastors earn modest salaries, often averaging £100 per month, making the prospect of further studies abroad almost unimaginable. Even if I had been allowed to study overseas through the providence of God, the thought of becoming an author, of weaving theological research into a structured academic work, seemed an intimidating challenge far beyond my abilities. But as Scripture reminds us: "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future" (Jeremiah 29:11).


The turning point in my journey came in 2006, when I was selected to participate in an exchange programme in the Netherlands, Romania, and Hungary, engaging in Hebrew studies and contextual theology with some European colleagues and scholars. This experience opened my eyes to the vastness of global Christianity and deepened my understanding of how faith is expressed across different cultures. Arriving in Scotland in 2012 to pursue my Masters and PhD at the University of Edinburgh, I encountered some of the most influential voices in World Christianity, particularly Professor Brian Stanley and Professor Afe Adogame. Their mentorship shaped my theological outlook, helping me understand that faith is not static or isolated, but dynamic, interconnected, and ever-expanding. During my studies, I was also privileged to undertake further theological engagements at Princeton Theological Seminary (USA, 2014) and Yale Divinity School (USA, 2015). Each of these experiences reinforced my belief that the global church is one body, united in Christ, regardless of national or denominational differences. As Paul writes: "There is neither Jew nor Greek, slave nor free, male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus" (Galatians 3:28).

Minister's Letter continued...

Today, as I serve within the Church of Scotland and assist in the ministry of my home church in the Diaspora, I realise that God has called me beyond borders. I bring with me not only my personal faith and pastoral experience from Cameroon but also a rich cross-cultural perspective shaped by years of ministry and theological inquiry across Africa, Europe, the Middle East, and North America. The famous words of John Wesley "The world is my parish" now resonate deeply with me. I understand that ministry is not confined to one geographical location but is about faithful service wherever God calls us. That is why this upcoming book launch and celebration at Newport-on-Tay Church of Scotland holds such deep meaning for me. It is a moment of gratitude, a testimony to God's faithfulness, and an opportunity to reflect on the journey that has led me here and the chapters still to come.



As we prepare for this special event, I warmly invite everyone — members of Newport-on-Tay Church of Scotland, friends from near and far, and all those with a heart for mission and theological dialogue. This will be more than a celebration of a book or an award. It will be a time f fellowship, worship, and reflection as we come together to thank God for His unfailing guidance and seek His wisdom for the journey ahead. As the Psalmist proclaims: "The Lord has done great things for us, and we are filled with joy" (Psalm 126:3).

Guild Projects 2025-2027

As part of the National Guild strategy for the next three years, 'Let us build a house', there are four new 'Guild Projects', which run from 2025 - 2027.

Each month we plan to give a bit of information about these projects. Last month we highlighted **Bibles for Bairns**, partnering with the Scottish Bible Society.

This month we highlight 'Build My Church'.

'Build My Church' is a project inspired by the work of the tiny Scottish Charity 'Bear Necessities for Bulgaria'.

Thirteen years ago Bear Necessities began supporting the children of a small, primarily gypsy village in rural Bulgaria to attend school. Currently Bear Necessities operate a soup kitchen and medical clinic, and provide winter boots to all school aged children in the village, as well as a few other key projects. They have been doing so with the support of Rumen Ganushev, a local minister.

This project 'Build My Church' will work with Rumen to plant a church at the centre of the large residential district of the city of Sliven. We want that church to have a truly holistic approach, meaning it will offer services for teaching and worship and prayer, but in time the vision is for the church to also provide free access to health care, food for the hungry, and training and support for the leadership of other churches in the district.
