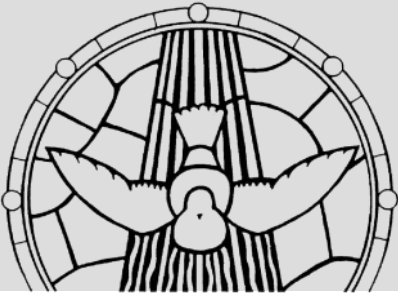

## MINISTER'S MESSAGE

**Luke 9:28-36**

### Seeking God's Approval for our Lives

The transfiguration of Jesus on Mount Hermon was a very decisive event in the career of Jesus Christ because it was here that he sought approval for the journey he was about to begin towards Jerusalem for the salvation of mankind. While he was there praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became as bright as a flash of lightning. Moses and Elijah appeared to him in glorious splendour, talking with Jesus. One

was the law-giver of Israel and the other was the greatest of the prophets, respectively. It was as if the princes of Israel's religious life and thought told Jesus to go on, because we are told that they spoke about his departure which he was about to bring to fulfilment in Jerusalem. Jesus could now set out to Jerusalem, certain that at least one little group of men knew who he was, certain that what he was doing was the consummation of all the life and thought and work of his nation, and certain that God approved of the step that he was about to take.

We began the season of Lent on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> February 2020 dubbed Ash Wednesday. Lent is the time of year in the Christian calendar when we journey with Jesus Christ through his trials and tribulations and eventual triumph over the powers of death and hell. Lent is the time when many through the sufferings of Jesus think and pray deeply about the problems of the world and some take personal retreats for spiritual nourishment. Others use the period of Lent to curb some of the things that hinder their walk with God or are not helpful for their wellbeing. Since Lent is a spiritual journey for all of us, we need to learn from Jesus and seek the face of God and his approval and guidance in much the same way as our master did on the mount of Transfiguration before engaging his journey to the cross.

I understand that we cannot go to the mountain and expect Moses and Elijah to appear. But we can seek God's approval for the things of our lives through prayers and by discussing our plans with fellow believers and family members as we pray together about them. As we begin the season of Lent, may this be a time for us to examine our ways, repent of our failings and imitate God's love and mercy. Let us engage the practice of prayer, fasting, donations and other spiritual acts of mercy.

The season of Lent will culminate in new life at Easter time. May we welcome this season of repentance and renewal with hope and grace. And may we seek to know the will of God in our lives.

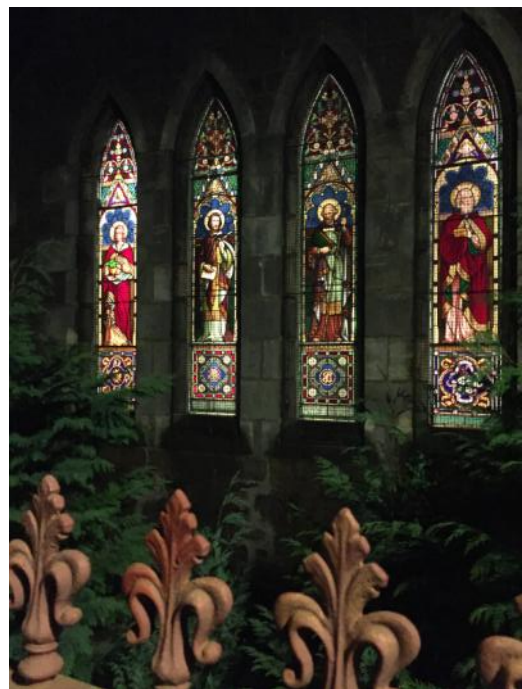

## Update on Malawi Safe House

As everyone will no doubt remember the church very kindly made a generous donation towards the furnishings of a safe house in Malawi from the Harvest offering. The progress in putting up the building was delayed by the annual rains which were still going on in mid-February. However the foundations are now laid and hopefully the walls will be going up soon. It is still likely to take two to three months before it is complete.



All the organisation including the build is being coordinated by a local organisation called Fisherman's Rest. They have worked in an area about 20 minutes drive south of Blantyre, the largest city in Malawi, for more than 20 years (see map). The following is adapted from the website (with permission).

'Fisherman's Rest was purchased in 1997 by the Chichlowsky family. Since then it has changed from a family home to a family run lodge, which supports long standing community programmes. Fisherman's Rest is set within an enchanting 500 acre forest with breathtaking views over the Great Rift Valley and our very own nature reserve.

For twenty years Fisherman's Rest has been working alongside its communities in the surrounding schools and villages. It is a thriving not for profit Lodge and Nature Reserve, which employs more than one hundred people from the local community.'

Current projects include improving water supply through the maintenance of bore holes and pumps, promoting education through school feeding programmes, building classrooms and equipping libraries, and improving the environment through for example tree planting.

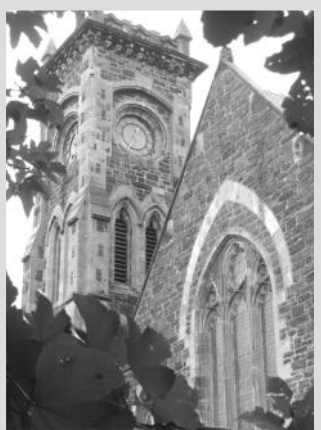

## Teaching So Far

We have been continuing looking at a series of sessions on the Life of Jesus. As before we are basing these sessions on the online Energize materials. # Youth Update

On Sunday 9th February we had our Interactive Workshop on 'What is Church?' led by Bruce Lockhart who is the Scripture Union Regional Worker for Perth, Kinross and Fife. He has worked for SU for 15 years and loves it! He came up and led this workshop. He spoke about the history of what church looked like in the old and new testament and gave the young people some time to imagine what our church could look like. We now know that Church isn't a building, but it can be when just two or three people who believe in God are gathered together, and Church can literally happen anywhere!



During the February mid-term holiday some of the Youth Seekers helped to paint the Youth Room. If you haven't seen it yet please come up any Sunday and have a look!

On February 21st we went to PowerPoint in Edinburgh. We heard Dom Lyons speaking on how we are made for more, and we heard how we need to listen to God about the plans he has for our lives. During the night, we really felt God's presence. He spoke through a few people, who shared Isaiah 53:3-4 and talked about those who may feel alone, bullied and segregated, that Jesus felt the same when he died on the cross. His love is there for us. All we need to do is accept that! It was a truly powerful evening!



We are returning to Lendrick Muir for our summer camp in 2020. The dates are Saturday 11th July – Saturday 18th July 2020. The camp is run by Scripture Union Scotland. The activities that are on offer would be Kayaking, Canoeing, Paddleboarding, Go Karting, Raft Building, Giant Swing, High Ropes, Low Ropes, Nukemball, Disc Golf, Foot Golf, Bungee Trampolining plus lots more. Cost is approx. £280pp. However, this is an accurate approximation from last year and the price may change. The age range is those leaving P6-S6. We have a few reserved spaces remaining. If you are interested in sending your young person(s) to camp please e-mail me with the young person's full name and the school year they are currently in. It will be a first come first served basis. We may be able to increase our allocation of spaces at a later date! What's coming up?

On Sunday 15th March, we are travelling to Grangemouth for Encounter. This is a prayer event run by Scripture Union Scotland. It is aimed at P7-S6. We would be leaving at 2pm and returning for 9pm. Each Encounter follows a prayer theme from the Bible. This year it is Ephesians 6:10-20, exploring how the apostle Paul tells us to be bold and WITHOUT FEAR. Many young people struggle with fear and anxiety - about faith and where they stand with God; about the future; self-image. We want to encourage them that God's mighty strength is available to them - that they can come and approach God in prayer with freedom, boldness and confidence. Programme includes Bible teaching, worship, chat, prayer workshops, prayer stations, prayer games – and a 2-course dinner in a lovely Macdonald hotel! The cost of this event is £5, and dinner will be provided at the event. If your young person is interested, please email me with the young person's full name and any dietary requirements.



On Sunday 22nd March we will be having our next interactive workshop which is 'A Faith Worth Sharing' with Catherine Dalton. Victor Hugo wrote "A faith is a necessity to a man. Woe to him who believes in nothing." We're often told to have faith - faith in yourself, in your friends, in medicine, even in democracy. But what do we mean when we talk about faith in relation to God? Together we'll be exploring what faith is, why it's worth shouting about, and some ways we can go about sharing our faith with those around us. Catherine came to know Jesus as a teenager. It changed everything in her life and since then she has been trying to share her faith with friends, family, and neighbours. She currently works for K2, a Christian Charity that partners with schools and churches in North East Fife to help children and young people grapple with the significance of Jesus.

Sunday Evenings – 6.30pm -8.30pm – Youth Café – P7-S6 - manna Café - We will be running a programme called 'At The Movies'. We are watching a few different films and are currently working our way through a couple of Marvel Films!

Tuesday Lunchtimes – S4-S6 – Madras College South Street – Room M6 - Discuss? – We discuss the big questions and provide God's Perspective
